"Masonic Island" by WB T. J. Brumfield III

There are a few places where you will find outdoor lodges, but only one of them is named Masonic Island.

It sits in Lake Metigoshe in the Turtle Mountains of North Dakota. The island was originally named Park Island until a brother purchased it with the intent of clearing the land and making a permanent spot for outdoor lodges. Brother V.B. Noble (who belonged to Tuscan Lodge) purchased the land from the government in 1899.

The Grand Lodge of North Dakota has been holding lodges on this 7.2 acre island for over 100 years, with the first meeting there in 1906. Tuscan Lodge and Westhope Lodge held three Master Mason conferrals on the island that year. They continued the tradition for the next six years. When Brother Noble died, Masons wanted to get back to that tradition. His estate sold the island to the North Dakota Masonic Foundation for \$277.25. The Grand Lodge built a new landing dock and stairs leading up to the outdoor lodge area and rededicated the island in 1934. The staircase of course features three, five and seven stairs.

The island has accommodations for Royal Arch and Eastern Star degrees, as well.

Perhaps the most interesting aspect of the island is its location right near the U.S./Canada border.

According to MW Brother Savaloja, "It is known fact that Masonic Island was probably the first place where visas to enter the United States were lifted for Masons of Canada during World War II by an agreement between President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Mackenzie King, who were both members of the fraternity.

"This agreement stated that the Canadian Masons could enter the United States by boat from the north shore of Lake Metigoshe, which is in Canada. As long as their feet never touched the shoreline of the lake in the U.S., and they landed only at Masonic Island when a meeting would be held, they would not be in violation of our wartime rules of entry."




Mizpah Lodge Ladies Night
